From Special Projects... by Marjorie Malek-Ahmadi

On February 2, 2022, FOL piloted a brand new program at Overton Elementary, the Books to Go Fair. Because we wanted to put more books into the hands of children, we agreed to bring three books for each student in the building. We had actually accumulated about 1,700 books. With delivery help from our drivers, Vicki Pettet and her husband, the books were delivered and arranged on tables in the library a day ahead of time.

Mrs. McCall, the Vice Principal, gave students goals of good behavior and excellent work on a reading exam. Students earned coupons to purchase their books at the fair.

All 322 students visited the fair, and both students and teachers seemed very excited at the selection of books. We left several hundred books for teachers to use in classrooms.

A big thank you to Lillian, LaFonda, and Connie who helped me serve classes.



Bylaws Changes

The following Bylaws changes approved by the FOL board are presented to be voted for or against at the Annual Meeting.

Article V, Section 1

Current sentence: An assistant treasurer, a non-voting position, shall be appointed by the Board.

Proposed change: An assistant treasurer, a non-voting position, may be appointed by the Board.

Article VI, Section 1

Current sentence: Nominations shall be submitted in writing to the membership at least one week prior to the Annual Meeting.

Proposed change: Nominations shall be submitted in writing to the membership at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting.

Article VIII, Section 1

Current sentence: Notice of the meeting shall be submitted to the members in writing at least one week prior to the meeting date.

Proposed change: Notice of the meeting shall be submitted to the members in writing at least one month prior to the meeting date.

Article VIII, add a Section 4

Proposed addition: Section 4. In the event unusual circumstances prevent holding the Annual Meeting in person, the meeting may be held virtually or through email, with virtual attendance or email votes constituting a quorum for conducting business.

Article X

Current sentence: Amendments to these Bylaws may be made at any Annual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted to and approved by the Board and in turn submitted to the membership in writing at least one week prior to the Annual Meeting.

Proposed change: Amendments to the Bylaws may be made at any Annual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted to and approved by the Board and in turn submitted to the membership in writing at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting.






From the Treasurer...


